The company has a growing equipment asset cost base of ~ \$16 million including a fleet of over 200 trucks and heavy equipment.

Enterprise constructs pipelines, installs facilities, builds roads/leases, performs directional drilling and underground installation of utilities in Western Canada.

Our pipeline & facility projects are primarily well head through separators to sales lines, up to 16" in diameter and complete gathering systems.

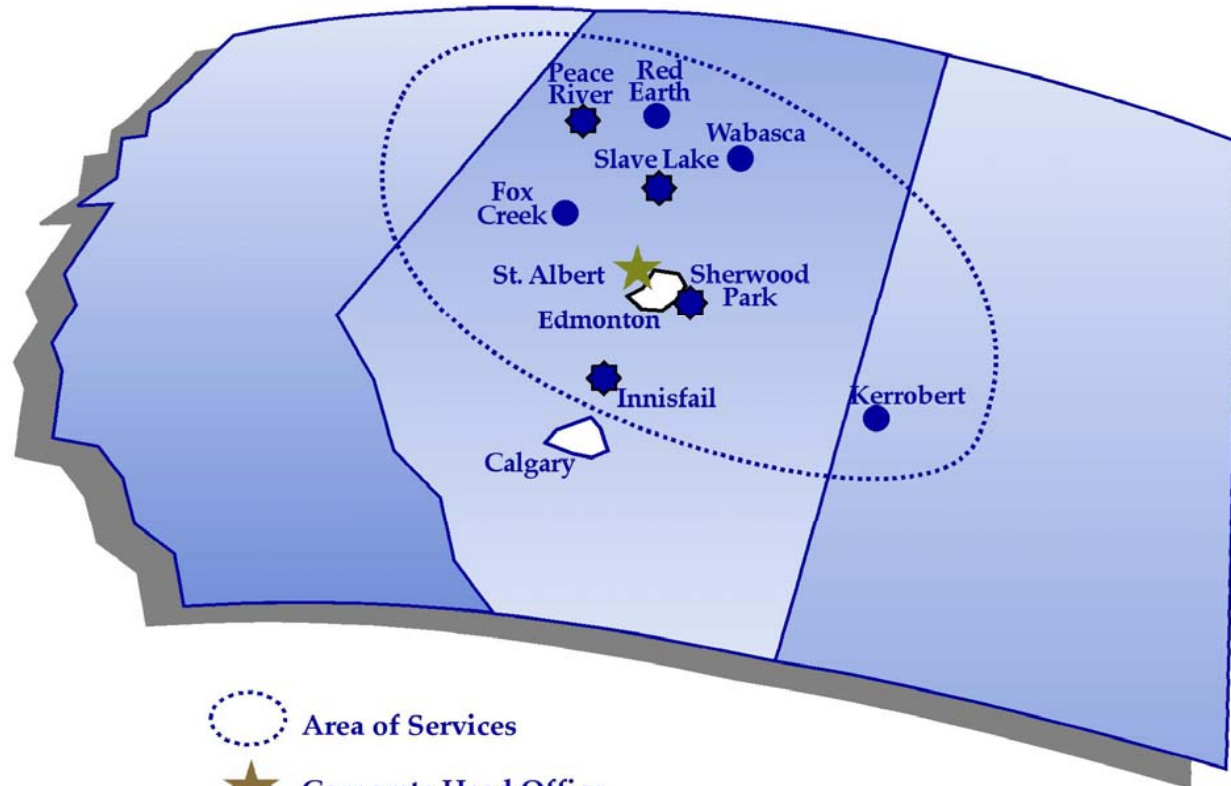

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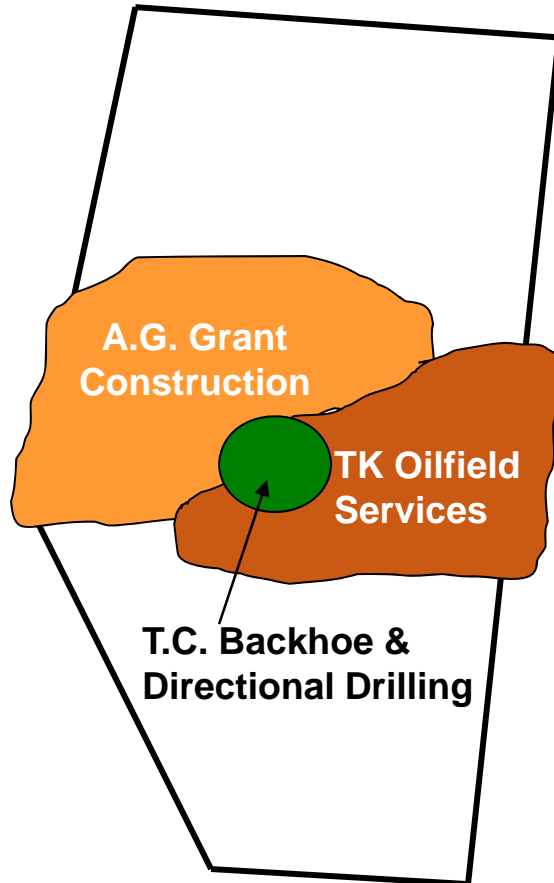

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## Acquisition History



✓ **Completed First Acquisition – August 2005**  
A.G. Grant Construction Ltd., located in Slave Lake, Alberta

✓ **Completed Second Acquisition – April 1<sup>st</sup> 2006.**  
TK Oilfield Services Inc., located in Wainwright, Alberta

✓ **Completed Third Acquisition – April 1<sup>st</sup> 2007.**  
T.C. Backhoe & Directional Drilling located in the greater Edmonton area.

✓ **Amalgamation of Operations – October 1<sup>st</sup> 2007**  
The Company successfully amalgamated all its operating companies under the name Enterprise Energy Services Inc. The reorganization will allow the Company to market all its services under the "Enterprise" banner.

## ENERGY SERVICES MARKET CONDITIONS

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2003 to Q2 2006 → Energy Services Sector experiences YOY spending increases by E&P's. Oilfield activity increases resulting in significant profitability in the sector. Services stocks advance, some to highest levels ever.

Q3 2006 to 2009 → Oil price falls to below \$40 from \$140 and Nat Gas remains uneconomic. E&P's reduced budgets YOY. In 2009 Oilfield activity falls to lowest levels in recent memory. Service sector stocks fall some below IPO prices.

2010 → Oil stabilizes between \$70 - \$84. Encana and other gas producers forecast NG forward of \$6.00 by the end of 2010. E&P's begin to increase development budgets. PSAC forecasts a 35% increase in wells drilled for 2010. Project flow starts to increase and gain momentum for Q3/4 and into 2011.

**CONCLUSION:** Energy Services sector is beginning to break out of the nearly 4 year down cycle. The remainder of 2010 and 2011 appear to be setting up for a return to robust activity levels. Some analysts are now forecasting improved profitability and higher valuations for the sector.

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## UNDERGROUND UTILITIES MARKET CONDITIONS

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2003 to 2008 → Rapid economic growth in Western Canada fueled a robust expansion of infrastructure. The swift pace of new construction resulted in excellent profitability and fleet expansion.

2008 to 2009 → Onset of the global recession cuts the top line by 20% although project flow remained fluid. Maintenance of aging utility infrastructure took a back seat to new construction for nearly a decade. Utility providers replaced new construction with maintenance projects. Federal and municipal gov's committed to significant infrastructure spending to battle the recession.

2010 → Economic growth returns. Enterprise secures a multi-year \$25 million contract with Fortis. Commercial and residential development also returns. Enterprise expands its roster of power linemen to service future growth in the sector.

**CONCLUSION:** The outlook for the underground utilities construction and maintenance division remains excellent. Expansion of the economy and infrastructure will drive this sector for at least another decade. Management believes that balanced and diversified positions in both the infrastructure and energy services sectors are the best path to generating shareholder value.
